ADVERTISING OF PHARMACEUTICAL SERVICES BY CHEMIST CONTRACTORS

- 1. This Annex advises chemist contractors of the removal of the restrictions on advertising in respect of NHS pharmaceutical services specified in the National Health Service (General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services)(Scotland) Regulations 1974, as amended. The removal is brought about by the National Health Service (General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services)(Scotland) Amendment (No 3) Regulations 1992 which comes into force on 22 December 1992.
- 2. Removal of these restrictions will overcome any conflict between the Royal Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain's Code of Ethics and the Terms of Service in relation to advertising. It will also assist contractors wishing to publicise new services arising from the recommendations of the Report of the Working Party on the Future Role of the Community Pharmaceutical Services.
