PATIENT'S SUPPORTER SERVICES: GUIDELINES

Summary

1. The Management Executive are keen that health boards develop services to help patients in their dealings with the NHS, in pursuance of the aims of the Patient's Charter and Framework for Action. Four pilot schemes are currently being mounted - in Dumfries and Galloway, Fife, Grampian and Lothian - and these will be closely evaluated and lessons shared with the Service. To complement this, guidelines have been developed which

- gives an explanation of how such services can help
- . gives advice to patients and carers on when such services might be helpful and how to use them
- gives advice to health professionals in the NHS on when such services might be useful and how to respond.
- . gives advice on how to find such services (please note that whilst there is no specific reference in the guidelines, the Mental Welfare Commission can play an important role in relation to mental health services)
- gives advice to patient's supporters themselves on their role and responsibilities.

These guidelines have been developed in close consultation with the Service, the professions, the voluntary sector, and local health councils, and I commend it to you.
