AIDS/HIV INFECTED HEALTH CARE WORKERS GUIDANCE ON THE MANAGEMENT OF INFECTED HEALTH CARE WORKERS

Summary

1. I enclose copies of guidance on the management of HIV infected health care workers, which is a revision of an interim document published under the same title in April 1993.

Background

- 2. The guidance includes and endorses the revised ethical statements from the General Medical Council, the General Dental Council and the United Kingdom Central Council for Nursing, Midwifery and Health Visiting, and should be read together with "AIDS-HIV Infected Health Care Workers: Practical Guidance on Notifying Patients" published in April 1993.
- 3. This revised document incorporates constructive comment received during consultation within the professions following publication of the April 1993 interim document, and has the approval of the Expert Advisory Group on AIDS and the UK Advisory Panel for Health Care Workers Infected with Bloodborne Viruses. The principal changes to the guidance are included at Annex A.
- 4. Similar guidelines are being published in England, Wales and Northern Ireland.

ANNEX A

AIDS/HIV INFECTED HEALTH CARE WORKERS GUIDANCE ON THE MANAGEMENT OF INFECTED HEALTH CARE WORKERS

1. Principal Changes

- The concept of **Exposure Prone Procedures** is precisely defined and it is emphasised that such procedures are performed by only a minority of all health care workers (para 3.3-3.6).
- The Role of the Occupational Health Physician is clarified and expanded (para 4.3, 4.6 and Section 6).
- The Chief Administrative Medical Officer is identified as the person who should be notified if an HIV infected health care worker has performed exposure prone procedures (para 4.5).
- The **UK Advisory Panel** should always be consulted by a CAMO/DPH before proceeding with a lookback exercise, even if there seems to be no doubt that exposure prone procedures have been performed (para 4.5). The Panel should also be consulted in cases of doubt. Panel advice should **only** be sought through its Medical Secretariat and members should not be approached directly. - Students in training should be apprised of the contents of the document, which applies to them during training and may have implications for their future choice of career (para 4.1 and 5.2).
- **Key recommendations**, listed at the beginning of the document, are highlighted throughout the main text in bold.
- 2. Your attention is drawn in particular to the **Key Recommendations**, and to the need for Health Boards and Trusts to:-
- maintain the awareness of new and existing staff of this guidance, and of the statements of the professional regulatory bodies, including agency staff, independent contractors and visiting health care workers (para 5.1).
- ensure that all staff are aware of how to contact the Chief Administrative Medical Officer who should be notified by all HIV infected health care workers who have performed **exposure procedures** (para 4.5).
- identify a suitable specialist occupational health physician who should be available to general medical and dental practitioners (NHS and private) as well as to hospital staff for consultation (para 6.4).

- make every effort to arrange suitable alternative work and retraining opportunities if there is a need for the duties of an HIV infected health care worker to be modified (para 5.4).
