"Firecode Health Technical Memorandum 85 Fire Precautions in Existing Hospitals (ISBN 0-11-321733-1), technically updates the "Draft Guide to Fire Precautions in Hospitals" issued jointly by the Home Office and Scottish Home and Health Department in 1982. The new HTM should be used from 1 May 1994 for guidance on fire safety in NHS hospitals. It applies to the upgrading and minor alterations of fire precautions which fall outside the scope of "Fire Safety: New Health Buildings in Scotland" issued by the Scottish Home and Health Department in 1987 under cover of DGM(1987)33.
- 4. "Firecode Health Technical Memorandum 86 Fire Risk Assessment in Hospitals" (ISBN 0-11-321734-X), replaces the HTM of the same number published in 1987 under the title "Assessing Fire Risk in Existing Hospital Wards". The new HTM provides a fire engineering approach to risk assessment based on the balancing of life risk, fire hazards and existing fire precautions. Using such an approach it is possible to determine what, if any, additional fire safety precautions are necessary. This guidance should be used from 1 May 1994.
