GUIDELINES ON FAILSAFE ACTIONS FOR THE FOLLOW-UP OF WOMEN WITH ABNORMAL CERVICAL SMEAR RESULTS

Summary

1. This MEL asks General Managers of Health Boards and Chief Executives of NHS Trusts to review arrangements for appropriate action in the event of an abnormal smear test result to ensure that they are in accordance with the attached Guidelines on Failsafe Actions for the Follow-up of Women with Abnormal Cervical Smear Histories.

Other information

2. The Guidelines have been drawn up by a working group within the Scottish Office Home and Health Department and based on Guidelines issued by the Department of Health. Both the Strong Report (1987) and the Invercipude Report (1993) made it clear that the responsibility for follow-up action in abnormal results was the responsibility of the originator of the smear. However, there must be failsafe systems in place to ensure that the correct follow-up action is taken, particularly for women apparently lost to follow-up.

Action

- 3. General Managers and Trust Chief Executives are asked to ensure that failsafe arrangements are in place for the follow-up of abnormal smear test results, taking account of the Guidelines on Failsafe Actions; and that the Guidelines inform contracting for the cervical screening programme.
- 4. Health Boards are asked to make arrangements for the distribution of the summary guidelines to General Practitioners, practice nurses and other appropriate health professionals.
- 5. Trust Chief Executives are asked to ensure that laboratories providing a cervical cytology service are provided with copies of these guidelines.
