## CLINICAL INVOLVEMENT IN CONTRACTING

### **Summary**

1. A handbook of good practice on the involvement of clinicians in the contracting process is attached for information. Although it was published by the NHS Executive in England, its messages are equally relevant to the enhancement of effective clinical involvement in contracting north of the Border.

#### Action

- 2. Health Boards and NHS Trusts are expected to take account of the enclosed guidance in improving existing arrangements for the involvement of clinicians in the contracting process.
- 3. Please ensure that the handbook is circulated to relevant managers and clinicians for their information, and is made available to GP fundholders.

## **Background**

- 4. The publication was produced in response to concerns expressed by clinicians that they were not being fully involved and that issues raised in the contracting process were not relevant to their clinical practice. The handbook is structured in 3 sections which are intended to:
  - 4.1 specify the "guiding principles" for establishing the pre conditions for effective clinical involvement in contracting;
