NURSE PRESCRIBING IN SCOTLAND: DEMONSTRATION PROJECTS

Summary

This letter outlines the arrangements for nurse prescribing in Scotland. Two demonstration projects have been set up and will take effect from 1 July 1996. Two GP practices, in Craigmillar, Edinburgh and in Forfar, have been selected to take part in the demonstration. Appropriately qualified nurses working in the 2 practices have undertaken the necessary training and the Pharmacy Practice Division of the Common Services Agency has developed a system for the processing and monitoring of prescriptions written by nurses. Regulations have been put in place to allow Community Pharmacists to dispense these prescriptions.

Action

Health Boards and NHS Trusts are asked to distribute the attached memorandum to all NHS prescribers, pharmacist contractors and appliance suppliers, and in addition to Unit General Managers, CAPOs, CANOs and CAMOs. Bulk supplies of the memorandum will be sent under separate cover.

NURSE PRESCRIBING IN SCOTLAND: DEMONSTRATION PROJECTS

Background

- 1. The implementation of nurse prescribing in Scotland is based on the recommendations contained in the Report of the Advisory Group on Nurse Prescribing 1989 (Crown Report). Appropriately qualified nurses have been authorised to prescribe within demonstration sites in England since October 1994.
- 2. Two demonstration sites have been chosen. Craigmillar Surgery is a non-fundholding practice serving approximately 8,600 patients in a large urban population on the south side of Edinburgh. The Green Street Group Practice is a fundholding practice serving more than 8,000 patients in Forfar and the surrounding rural area.

Nurse Prescribers

3. 'Nurse prescriber' means a nurse or health visitor who is qualified to order listed drugs and medicines and listed appliances on an NHS prescription form. Nurse prescribers are first level nurses on the professional register who have a registered health visiting qualification or a recorded district nurse qualification and who have successfully completed nurse prescribing training of a standard considered sufficient by the United Kingdom Central Council (for Nursing, Midwifery and Health Visiting), the UKCC. At the time of prescribing, the nurse prescriber must be employed by a Health Board or an NHS Trust, or employed by a doctor whose name is included in a medical list.

The UKCC will annotate the professional register to indicate that a nurse or health visitor has successfully completed training. The UKCC may be contacted by a pharmacist or employer to confirm it is using telephone number 0171 631 3200.

Preparations which nurses may prescribe under the Drug Tariff

4. Medical preparations - see Annex A

Appliances and Reagents (including Wound Management Products) - see Annex B.

Prescription Forms GP10 (PN) and GP10 (CN)

5. For practice nurses the form is a GP10 (PN) and is coloured lilac. For health visitors and district nurses the form is a GP10 (CN) and is coloured green.

6. Nurse prescription forms will be stamped to include the nurse's name and UKCC PIN; the full address and telephone number of the GP practice and a PPD code unique to each nurse prescriber.

Action by Dispensers

7. Nurse prescription forms should be sorted by prescriber name with the lilac practice nurse forms uppermost. Nurse prescription forms will be part of the "C" group for submission to PPD.

Monitoring of Nurse Prescribing

8. Scottish Prescribing Analysis (SPA) Level I and II reports will be provided to all nurse prescribers during the demonstration. The costs of prescribing by nurses will be included in budget schedules for the GP practice. The costs will not be separately identified in those schedules but they will appear in PRISMS data.
