# Summary

# Layout of Form

- 3. The layout of the back of the form has also been revised. The revisions are as follows:-
  - Part C Section G-K date of birth box on the right-hand side;
  - Part C after Section K an indication that entitlement may be checked with DSS;

New Part D - for patients' signature, name, address and postcode. This part to be completed by patients who have claimed exemption/remission from charges under Part C.

- 4. The revised forms are being phased in and should come into use as current stocks are exhausted.
- 5. A copy of the back of the revised form GP 10 is shown overleaf. Please note that the GP14 does not include category L ie no-charge contraceptives.
- 6. Any enquiries about this memorandum should be addressed to the relevant Health Board or Trust.

- If you need a lot of medication you may want to buy a prepayment certificate.
