REPORT ON THROMBOLYSIS FOR HEART ATTACKS

Summary

- 1. A Report by the Scottish Health Purchasing Information Centre on Thrombolysis for Heart Attacks is attached.
- 2. The Report examines the use of thrombolytic drugs in the treatment of heart attacks.
- 3. The Report concludes that:
 - Thrombolysis is a valuable, life-saving, and highly cost-effective treatment, which is under-used in Scotland.
 - The earlier thrombolysis is given, the more effective it is. There is a great opportunity for general practitioners to make a significant contribution to reducing heart disease mortality by giving thrombolysis in the community, although the difficulties in the field should not be underestimated.
 - For treatment in hospital the drug of choice is streptokinase for all patients except those who have had the drug before.
 - For treatment outside hospital the drug of choice for general practice use is at present urokinase, but this may be replaced by new drugs now coming on to the market. At present urokinase does not have a licence for this purpose (though it is licensed for other uses such as DVT and pulmonary embolism) but is used on a named-patient basis.

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

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- Asprin remains valuable in heart attacks, because it inhibits further clotting in the artery, and should be given in addition to thrombolysis.
- The giving of thrombolysis by General Practitioners should be strongly supported by Health Boards and Cardiologists.

Action

5. Health Boards should use this Report when assessing local needs. Health Boards are asked to pass copies of this circular to all General Practitioner practices within their area. Sufficient copies will be provided for this purpose.
