COMMISSIONING CANCER SERVICES: CANCER GENETICS SERVICES IN SCOTLAND

Summary

A copy of the final report, Cancer Genetics Services in Scotland is attached. Responses to the consultation exercise earlier this year were in the main supportive of the proposals set out and the enclosed final version has been amended as appropriate to reflect the comments made.

Additional funding of £250,000 to cover the costs of Genetics Associates' posts to be established in the Regional Genetics Clinics was announced by the Secretary of State on 21st October 1998. This sum has been included in the allocations to Health Boards for 1999-2000.

Action

The report recommends how genetics screening services should be developed for people with a significant family history of breast, colorectal or ovarian cancer. Health Boards and Regional Genetics Clinics will be responsible for developing appropriate frameworks to take forward implementation as set out in Chapter 11 of the Report. However, it is anticipated that there will be a need for more detailed guidance to assist with this process.
