CONSULTATIVE PANEL ON THE REGISTRATION OF NURSING HOMES AND INDEPENDENT HOSPITALS

Summary

CONSULTATIVE PANEL ON THE REGISTRATION OF NURSING HOMES AND INDEPENDENT HOSPITALS

TERMS OF REFERENCE

1. The Terms of Reference of the Panel are:-

"To consider and advise on problems or difficulties arising between the Health Board and the proprietor, or prospective proprietor, concerning the registration or proposed cancellation of registration of any nursing home or independent hospital which requires to be registered under the Nursing Homes Registration (Scotland) Act 1938."

Procedure

- 2. It will be the responsibility of Health Boards to advise existing proprietors and future applicants for registration of the existence and purpose of the Panel and to explain the reference procedure.
- 3. Reference to the Panel should be mutually agreed but where it has not proved possible to resolve a dispute bilaterally, a Health Board will be expected to accede to a request by the proprietor of a home for reference to the Panel, except in those cases where the Health Board decide that in the interests of patients' welfare, the procedures for cancellation of registration must be instigated immediately.
- 4. References will require to be given in writing, providing concise details of the dispute, and will be sent to the Secretary of the Panel and the other party and should only be made prior to the Health Board making an order refusing registration or cancelling registration under the 1938 Act. The existence of the Panel is not seen in any way as affecting the rights and powers of Health Boards under the 1938 Act or the right of appeal of a proprietor to the Sheriff.
- 5. No fees will be charged for referring a matter to the Panel.

MEMBERSHIP

6. The Panel consists of around 20 members from whom the Chairman will select the membership of individual Panels to consider specific cases. Individual Panels will comprise 7 members (with a quorum of 5 members). These will be the Chairman, a Health Board representative from outwith the Board involved in the dispute, a representative from an appropriate independent sector representative body, a lay/user representative and 3 other appropriate "expert" representatives depending on the nature of the dispute eg, a nurse, general practitioner etc.

PROCEDURE FOR SETTING UP PANEL

7. When a referral is received by the Secretary of the Panel, the Chairman will examine the papers and will decide how the case should be handled. The Chairman will decide upon the composition of the Panel for the particular case, having regard to the nature of the referral. A hearing will be established within 40 days of a referral and intimation of a hearing will be given to the Health Board and the private nursing home or independent hospital 30 days before the hearing. In some cases the Panel may feel that it may need to visit the nursing home or hospital concerned. Where a visit to a home is required, the "host" Board will be asked to provide accommodation in which the hearing will be held. This would enable the visit to be made in the morning and the Panel to sit in the afternoon. The nursing home will also be informed where the Panel wishes to visit the premises.

ADVICE

8. The advice of the Panel will be conveyed by the Chairman in writing to the parties involved. The Panel's advice will be disseminated to other Health Boards and nursing home organisations provided both parties agree. As the Panel is not a statutory body, its advice is not legally binding on either party, but both parties will be expected to adhere to the advice and seek to resolve their difficulties in the light of it.
