CHILD HEALTH SUPPORT GROUP

Summary

1. This letter outlines the work of the Child Health Support Group (CHSG), including:

- its current membership (Annex A)
- its remit (Annex B); and
- its forward workplan (Annex C).

Background

2. The Child Health Support Group was established in 2000 by the Minister for Health and Community Care, to harness professional expertise in driving forward improvements in child health and in the quality of child health services across Scotland.

3. The Group comprises professionals from medicine, nursing, allied health professions, social work and education from services across Scotland to advise on and assist progress of policies and service developments at national and local level. It is chaired by Malcolm Wright, Chief Executive of NHS Dumfries and Galloway. A full membership list is attached at **Annex A**.

4. The CHSG works with Scottish Ministers, the Scottish Executive, the NHS, local authorities and the voluntary sector to improve child health and child health services.

5. In its first two years, the CHSG:

- Developed a national template for Child Health Services which is now being used by NHS Boards to plan and commission their services.
- Ensured that a local Lead Commissioner for Children's Health Services has been appointed in each NHS Board.
- Visited all NHS Boards in Scotland to review local health care systems and offer advice and support on development.

- Contributed to development of the Scottish Executive Health Department's self assessment tool for children's services.
- Provided valuable input to a review in Scotland of better integrated services for children, the conclusions of which are published in the report *For Scotland's Children*.
- Organised a successful child health conference in February 2002 to discuss and disseminate information about good practice and innovation in Scottish child health services.

6. The CHSG has successfully raised the profile and priority of child health services locally as well as nationally and has played a crucial part in sharing expertise and advice about best practice across the country. The Group now has comprehensive information about child health services in Scotland, and where there are strengths and areas for development.

Future work

7. The Group has revised its remit and workplan for the next two years to continue and extend its work in driving forward improvements in partnership with the Lead Child Health Commissioners in NHS Boards. A copy of the Group's revised remit is attached at **Annex B**.

8. The Group will continue to provide expert advice to Scottish Ministers on developing and improving child health across all services. It will also have an important role in supporting the Scottish Cabinet Sub Committee on Children's Services which was set up, and is chaired by, the First Minister to ensure real improvement in services to meet children's needs.

9. The Child Health Support Group has identified five key work areas and has established workgroups to take these forward:

- Promoting social justice through better integrated and high quality services for children
- Supporting regional planning groups in reviewing specialist paediatric services
- Promoting high quality community based child health services, including work with the national clinical standards body in Scotland to develop national standards for child health
- Championing and developing child and adolescent mental health services; and
- Promoting the involvement of children and young people in NHSScotland.

10. The workplan is outlined in more detail at **Annex C**.

Action

11. Chief Executives and Directors are invited to draw this letter to the attention of all with a responsibility or interest in child health and child health services.

12. Chief Executives and Directors are invited to note the role and remit of the Child Health Support Group and to seek its advice when such advice would be considered useful.

CHILD HEALTH SUPPORT GROUP - REMIT

The Group will work with the Scottish Executive, the NHS, local authorities and the voluntary sector to improve child health and children's health services. The Group will:

- Provide expert advice to Scottish Ministers on the development and improvement of child health across all services
- Assist the identification of innovation and improvements in services nationally and locally
- Provide advice on development and evaluation of services with a focus on promoting child health and well-being
- Support the NHS in Scotland to strengthen local service provision and delivery of children's health and well-being
- Be a catalyst for the dissemination and implementation of best practice nationally, and
- Be a focus for communication between stakeholders concerned with child health, including children, young people and their families
