



Dear *Ronnie Fraser,*

I am writing as a concerned Community Pharmacist who runs a Pharmacy in Balornock, Glasgow. If the recommendations made by the OFT are followed the removal of control of entry regulations for pharmacy contracts would have serious results.

Presently in Scotland we have a rational distribution of Pharmacies in our local communities giving easy access to Pharmacy services. If deregulation occurs a clustering effect around Health Centres and Supermarket Pharmacies would happen. It is the small local neighbourhood Pharmacy that is most likely to be adversely affected by this deregulation.

Community Pharmacy is a valuable neighbourhood resource to the elderly and infirm, families on low income, nursing mothers with young children and those in disadvantaged communities. These patient groups recognise and rely on the local services and would be the ones to suffer if small businesses were forced to close.

NHS activity makes up 80% of the turnover of the average Pharmacy. If the OFT recommendation is accepted the goals of the Scottish Executive strategy for Pharmaceutical care outlined in 'The Right Medicine' would not be achieved.

The present regulations have some shortcomings and some flexibility in interpretation of the regulations to help build on the rational distribution with Pharmacies situated in the right places to address local needs. I believe that abolition of the current regulations is not going to achieve the best outcome for patients.
